

Cheat Sheet for 2011-2012 Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest Permit Program

- Alaska Dept. of Fish and Game (ADF&G) will administer the 2011-2012 Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest Permit Program (Ahtna Tene Nene' C&T community hunt)
- Alaska Dept. of Fish & Game will distribute moose and caribou harvest tickets/report cards
- Head of Household must read the 2006-170-BOG findings and sign a moose/caribou certification statement
- Hunters must show hunting license to receive their harvest tickets/report cards
- Harvest report cards must be mailed or given to ADF&G office in Glennallen within 5 days after successful moose/caribou hunt, and within 15 days after the close of season
- If you sign up for the Copper Basin community hunt, you can still hunt under the Federal subsistence hunt in Unit 11, and a portion of Unit 12, Unit 13 and Denali Park Lands
- You must abide by State Regulations and hunt conditions of the Copper Basin community hunt
- If anyone in the household is on the Failure to Report List, the individual will not receive a moose harvest ticket/report card, if the head of household is on the Failure to Report List, the household will not receive a caribou harvest ticket/report card

- You may return state moose drawing permits before the Copper Basin community hunt begins and be able to participate in the community hunt
- You have the option to hunt for moose only and not caribou or both moose and caribou
- You must share the meat and other parts of the moose and caribou with Elders and Disabled and anyone on the list of participants in the Copper Basin Community Hunt; how much you share will be your decision
- Up to 70 Any Bulls can be taken in Unit 11 and specific areas of Unit 13; season dates are August 10-Sept. 20
- When 70 Any Bulls are taken in specific areas then that hunt area will be closed and a moose antler restriction hunt will take place
- Unit 11 moose antler restriction hunt is Spike Fork or 50” antlers or 3 or more brown tines on one side; season dates are August 10-Sept. 20
- In Unit 12 there is no Any Bull moose hunt, moose antler restriction hunt is spike/fork, or 50” antlers, or 4 or more brow tines on one side; season dates are August 24 and August 28 and September 8-September 17
- Unit 13 moose antler restriction is Spike Fork, or 50” antlers or 4 or more brown tines on one side; season dates are August 10-Sept. 20
- You can hunt only in Unit 13 for caribou
- Up to 300 caribou can be taken; and if an Emergency Order isn’t in effect the season dates are August 10-September 20 and

October 21-March 31

- If you take (1) one caribou under the Copper Basin community hunt, you may also take (1) caribou under the federal subsistence permit hunt, and other members of your household may take the 2 caribou allowed under the federal hunt.
- You may have a Designated Hunter hunt for you, but you are still responsible for returning moose/caribou harvest report cards to ADF&G
- A Designated Hunter form will be required by ADF&G
- You must bring in from the field all edible meat from the moose's frontquarters, hindquarters, ribs, neck, and backbone, as well as the head, heart, liver, kidneys, stomach and hide and meat of the moose's head, frontquarters, hindquarters, and ribs must be remain naturally to the bones until delivered to the place where it is to be processed for human consumption
- All edible meat from the caribou's frontquarters, hindquarters, ribs, neck, and backbone, as well as the heart, liver, kidneys, and fat must be brought in from the field; and prior to October 1, meat of the caribou's frontquarters, hindquarters, and ribs must remain naturally attached to the bones until delivered to the place where it is processed for human consumption
